



## WINE AND BIRDS PACIFIC COAST & CASABLANCA VALLEY



Duration: Full day of approx. 10 hours  
Starts / Ends: Santiago

Early departure from Santiago toward the Pacific coast. During the morning we will be looking for the endemics of the Humboldt Current as the Guanay and Red-legged Cormorant, the Peruvian Booby, the Grey Gull and the Inca Tern and the Chilean endemic Seaside Cinclodes. We also will be birding at different wetlands and prairies in the valleys to look for the Many-coloured Rush-Tyrant, the brood-parasitic Black-headed Duck, the scarce Warbling Doradito and many other species.

After the birding experience we will drive to the valley of Casablanca, famous for its high quality grapes, where we will enjoy a pic-nic lunch and wine tasting at the small family-owned winery, Bodegas Re.

Some of the species that can be found in this trip: Peruvian Booby, Inca Tern, Seaside Cinclodes, Ruddy Turnstone, Baird`s Sandpiper, Ticking Doradito, Red gartered Coot, Spot-flanked Gallinule, Grey Gull, Franklin`s Gull, Guanay Cormorant, Yellow-billed Pintail, Speckled teal, Silver Teal, Lake Duck, Crested Duck, Red Shoveler, White Tufted Grebe, Silvery Grebe, Pied-billed Grebe, Cocoi Heron, among others.

## What is included:

Pic-nic lunch at the winery, wine tasting, mineral water to re-fill personal bottles.

Transportation: Private ground transportation, Professional Driver with license A2.

Protected areas entrance fees.

Equipment provided: Spotting scope, check list of birds.

Equipment required: Sun-hat and sunscreen, comfortable shoes. Bottles for water.

Not included: Tips, insurances and any other item not specified in this file.

Guide: Professional Bilingual Naturalist guide with International WFR.
